Live Webinar: Medication-Assisted Treatment: Overcoming Barriers to Improve Access for Patients



## **Activity Overview**

As regulators continue the fight against the opioid epidemic, the next step is ensuring medication-assisted treatment (MAT) is available for those patients suffering with opioid use disorder (OUD). Unfortunately, few OUD patients have access to MAT due to barriers such as limited access to treatment, the social stigma, cost, and lack of education. The federal government has prioritized expanding access to MAT as an important element in reducing OUDs and overdoses. Because pharmacists are among the most accessible and trusted health care providers, they are in a unique position to provide OUD patients with essential care through MAT.

This webinar will discuss the patient's struggle with addiction and recovery, as well as steps states are taking to increase MAT access. NABP President Timothy Fensky will also provide an overview of his presidential initiative to increase access to pharmacist-provided MAT to those suffering from OUD.
