2022 West Virginia Legislative Session Update

The West Virginia 2022 Legislative Session concluded on March 12, 2022, with several pharmacy-related bills passing this session. They include updates to pharmacy practice rules, collaborative pharmacy practice, a donated drug repository bill, and a consumer choice for pharmacy services bill. Once the legislation is completed with Governor Jim Justice's signature, comprehensive summaries of the changes will be provided.

West Virginia COVID-19 Vaccination Updates

As we approach the summer and what could be the next coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) surge, the Board will continue to provide the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) updates for vaccination. The Board is now providing a location for pharmacists to reference fraudulent prescriptions. Once the information is verified with the prescriber that there is a breach of prescription security and permission granted, pharmacists will be notified and the information can be referenced on the Board's [website](#). There were 1,848 individuals who completed all or part of the survey. The West Virginia Pharmacy Workload Task Force members have been meeting to formulate recommendations for the Board to address findings from the West Virginia Pharmacy Workload Study. The Board looks forward to bringing you those recommendations and additional details of the report.

Board Investigating Complaints of Workload Patient Safety Concerns

In addition to the work that the Workload Task Force is doing, the Board is investigating complaints related to pharmacy workload and patient safety concerns. As a reminder, any individual may make a complaint to the Board concerning a licensee or registrant and the Board may accept an anonymous complaint if the information provided is adequate to begin an investigation.
