



Avoid Examination Roadblocks

When preparing to take your North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination® (NAPLEX®) or Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination® (MPJE®), you can easily avoid these common roadblocks some candidates face during the testing process.

Understanding Eligibility

The boards of pharmacy set the exam eligibility requirements. Although NABP confirms eligibility for some states, the boards ultimately make all eligibility decisions. Once granted eligibility, **your eligibility period is 1 year.**

Remember, after your eligibility is granted, you can purchase your exam. We recommend scheduling your exam soon after receiving your authorization to test (ATT).



Don't Be Turned Away Due to ID Issues

As of January 2023, only **1 ID** is required at the testing center.

- You must present a current, valid, government-issued ID.
- Your ID must contain your photo and signature.
- **Your name must match exactly on your ID and ATT.**

Accept NDA, Avoid Exam Forfeiture

Before you start the exam at the testing center, you will be presented with a non-disclosure agreement (NDA). **The NDA must be read and accepted within 5 minutes, or your exam will be forfeited.** You should read the *Bulletin* ahead of time to avoid missing this step. If your exam is forfeited, you will need to apply for a new ATT and purchase a resit fee.
